Space for detailing extra bookings and twin room bookings:

Dr Martyn Lloyd-Jones (1899–1981) was one of the most influential leaders in British Evangelicalism in the middle part of the twentieth century. With the course of time (it is now 45 years since his death), his life and what he stood for have become more distant as we look into the past. But an understanding of Lloyd-Jones, and in particular the theology that fuelled his ministry, will be of great usefulness as we seek to live faithful Christian lives in the twenty-first century.

In his book, *Seven Leaders*, Iain Murray provides a helpful starting point from which to think about Dr Lloyd-Jones' life and work:

After Dr Lloyd-Jones had been a preacher for over fifty years, his health failed and it was evident he would not preach again. A visitor who came to see him after that time sought to express sympathy by saying, 'It must be a disappointment for you that you are no longer able to preach.' He promptly replied, 'Not at all, I did not live for preaching.' The statement, 'I did not live for preaching' is fundamental. To ignore it, and to go straight to considering him as a preacher, is to miss the key both to his preaching and to his life. He meant, of course, that there is something greater than preaching. What that is, comes out in his words, 'A life spent in communion with God is the only life worth living.' To be reconciled to God, to live in his presence, is a far higher thing than simply working for him. To disciples who thought too much of their service, Jesus said, 'in this rejoice not, that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven' (Luke 10:20). To know God is 'life eternal'. Lloyd-Jones felt the weight of the warning that he gave to others, 'You may spend fifty years of a very busy life in preaching the gospel, or in organising this or that, and you may know God no better at the end of the fifty years than you did at the beginning.'

When Lloyd-Jones was a medical student he learned a principle that would stay with him all his life; it was that a patient should be looked at as a whole before attention is given to any particular part: 'Always look at the general before the particular', was the maxim. 'Look first at the big thing.' This applies equally to an understanding of the life of Lloyd-Jones. How he prepared his sermons, how he got his sermons, and such like, are details. The big thing for him was theology, what he believed about God.

Venue

Yarnfield Park is the home of the Banner Youth Conference. Situated in the village of Yarnfield in Staffordshire, and easily accessible from the M6, the purpose-built conference centre provides good facilities, including cafeteria-style catering, outdoor space for recreation, an on-site Costa coffee bar, and an exercise room.

Accommodation is in ensuite bedrooms, each equipped with a desk, tea and coffee making facilities, and Wi-Fi. Towels are provided.

There will be an extensive Book Room with Banner of Truth books available at special conference prices.
